Concepts



- Consortium licensing should lower the subscription fee for each institution
- 2. Lower subscription eeswould allow institutions with smaller Japanese studies programs to have greater digital access,
- 3. Larger number of participating institutions would expand the participating light light for a source of participating to be partited to be participating to be parti
- 4. Because institutions are spread across different time zones, multiple access reins would expand accessibility for users in each institution,
- 5. Institutions that do not have a Japanese or East Asian librarian would find it easier to participate in a digital resources subscription contract.


