The japanese special collection of UCLouvain libraries

A collection related to the history of the University of Louvain

1914: the university was burned down by the German army. The entire library collections are destroyed

1915: An international appeal is launched to help rebuild the university and the library's holdings. Japan responded to this appeal and provided to the university the largest donation of Japanese books given to an European library before the WWII.

1924-1926: 3.202 titles in 13.682 volumes were shipped to Louvain.

1970's: separation of the university between Dutch-speaking and French-speaking members. Foundation of the Catholic University of Louvain in Wallonia in Louvain-la-Neuve.

The library's collections are shared and the Japanese donation is allocated to the French-speaking university.

The structure of UCLouvain libraries

- **91** staff members (76 EFT)
- **1.900.000** books and **112.164** ebooks
- 42.900 physical and 22.800 electronical periodicals titles
- 12 libraries spread over 4 geographical sites
- 1 central service made up of 4 entities:
- libraries activities coordination department
- research data management and open repository department
- electronic resources department
- department of conservation, valorization of collections and digital production

Department of conservation, valorization of collections and digital production

Missions:

- Manage the central repository that receives documents transferred by our libraries and external donations: 8600 m² for 1.500.000 volumes including more than 300.000 documents produced before 1830. Secured storage area for more than 35.000 volumes of precious and old documents.
- Define the prevention policies and emergency plans for the collections
- Conduct research on heritage collections and valorization actions: virtual and physical exhibitions, presentation of collections at various events
- Digitization of documents, development of the digital library platform and collaboration with other universities and partners

Staff: 7 persons (4,8 EFT)

The Japanese donation: a precious collection among heritage materials

Majority of books dates from Edo period - Selection included a number of precious printed editions and manuscripts

Conditions of conservation

Books and scrolls have been restored and packaged in custommade boxes before being sent to Belgium

The storage room for old and precious books responds correctly to climatic conservation standards

Use of the collection

No specialized department of Japanese studies at UCLouvain Only consultations made by Japanese specialists from Japan

No specialized librarian with a good knowledge of the Japanese language

Valorize and promote the collection

First step: make the collection known to UCLouvain

- 2012-2015: Collaborations in exhibitions organized by UCLouvain: choice of some books in the collection according to the exhibitions themes
- "Made in Japan" day in 2014: presentation of the collection to university authorities and books exhibition

Second step: promote the collection outside the university

- 2015-2016-2017: presentation at various conferences and to the Ambassador of Japan in Belgium
- 2016 and 2019: organization of exhibitions entirely dedicated to the collection
- Using images of the collection for our libraries promotion supports



2015: Selection of 50 titles reflecting the variety of the collection

Digitization of 185 volumes – 16.333 pages

Encoding of the records in the libraries catalogue

60% of the total budget financed by the UCLouvain Cultural

2019: 19 titles added – 60 volumes – 1.772 pages

Collection académique ancienne

Collectio academica antiqua ou la collection académique ancienne regroupe les ouvrages publiés par les membres de l'ancienne université de Louvain, dès sa fondation en 1425 jusqu'à la fermeture de l'université par les Français en 1797. Durant cette période l'université de Louvain fonctionnait non seulement comme l'université « nationale » des Pays-bas (méridionaux), mais elle avait aussi une excellente réputation chez des étudiants et des professeurs de toute l'Europe.

Orientalia

Les bibliothèques de l'UCL ont collaboré au projet Manumed visant à créer une bibliothèque virtuelle regroupant des documents numériques relatifs aux pays méditerranéens, libres de droits d'auteurs et provenant de bibliothèques, de centres d'archives et de musées, de collections publiques ou privées.

Les documents de l'UCL qui sont venus enrichir ce corpus ont notamment été sélectionnés parmi les fonds de microfilms de manuscrits orientaux conservés à la réserve patrimoniale des bibliothèques. La totalité des documents des bibliothèques de l'UCL numérisés dans le...



Collection japonaise

La collection de livres anciens japonais a été offerte à l'Université de Louvain par le Japon dans les années 1920 dans le cadre de l'œuvre internationale de Louvain.

Cette importante donation comporte 3.202 titres en 13.682 volumes et se compose de livres manuscrits, de livres imprimés selon différents procédés et de rouleaux. La grande majorité des ouvrages datent de la période d'Edo (1600 à 1868). Le plus ancien manuscrit de la collection date du 13ème sièrle


