NIHU International Prize in Japanese Studies is accepting nominations for 2023.

### NIHU International Prize in Japanese Studies

The Inter-University Research Institute Corporation National Institutes for the Humanities (hereinafter, "NIHU") established the NIHU International Prize in Japanese Studies in January 2019 with cooperation from the Kuraray Foundation.

### Eligible persons

The prize is awarded to studies in fields related to Japan and the humanities, including literature, linguistics, history, folklore, ethnology, and environmental studies. The laureate of the prize will be presented with a certificate of merit, a trophy and a cash prize of 20,000 U.S. dollars.

The laureate will also be invited to the presentation ceremony to be held in Japan (planned in December 2023) and a commemorative lecture meeting will also be held.
