# The number of libraries questionnaires were sendt

- Questionnaires were mainly sent to libraries attached to institutions registered at NIAS. In addition, they were send to academic libraries in the 5 Nordic countries which offer Japan studies, or where there are known to be Japanese / East Asian collections.
- Iceland 2 institutions, send to 3 pers. 2 replies received
- Denmark- 4 institutions, send to 4 pers. 4 replies received
- Sweden 11 institutions, send to 14 pers. 5 replies received
- Finland 7 institutions, send to 8 pers. 1 replies received
- Norway 4 institutions, send to 5 pers. 2 replies received + 1

# Libraries with Japanese collection

- 9 libraries answered they have Japanese collection
  - Iceland 1 (The National and University Library of Iceland)
  - Denmark 3 (Ringgadebiblioteket, University of Aarhus \ Copenhagen Business School Library \ Department of Cross-Cultural and Regional Studies, Asian Studies Section Library \ Copenhagen University)
  - Sweden 2 (Stockholm University Library, \*The International Library)

\*Not academic library

## Situation today

- Although the main institution offers Japanese Studies in some kind of form, the library has not managed to cope with this situation
- Although there exist Japan related sources outside the main library which are still owned by the university, for instance in research labs or study rooms, it happens occasionally that the library does not have a direct share in these sources
- If the library, who maintains administration of materials, does not have access to some sources, the situation limits the range of use
- At such academic institutions, there may be difficulties to sufficiently spread digitally-based information in addition to paper-based administration



#### **Future issues**

- Also at institutions which did not answer the questionnaires, or libraries which answered no Japanese related materials, Asian Studies and Japanese Studies are offered in various forms
- Due to insufficient communication between main institution and its library, if there is not a strong and active support system for promoting Asian and Japanese Studies, necessary information may not reach relevant users
- In order to cope with these challenges:
  - Academic scholars positioned at the specific academic institution have to show a strong interest in the institutional library
  - Libraries has to create a situation in which library service information can be spread beyond the frameworks of the respective institutions
  - Libraries has to strengthen the contact with the scholarly networks, and in this way make the spread of information possible
