

Conservation Decisions at CUL/IS

Information from Janet Gertz

(Director, Preservation and Digital Conversion)

- The distribution of scarce resources
- Conservation Lab is relatively small:
3 conservators and 2 technicians who serve for
5 special libraries
- Curators and conservators, together they decide
on the top priority items and which treatments to
give

- Do the right thing for damaged and endangered items, but in a cost effective way
- The East Asian Library is allocated 200 hours annually
- The conservators examined the damaged scroll and determined:
 - To fit all the broken pieces back together
 - Put the whole scroll on a safe backing to stabilize it
 - To make a proper storage box for it


- The work would take as much as 160 hours, or 80% of the East Asian Library's time for the entire year.
- Because it is such an important item, the curators decided to have the treatment done



Conservation Treatment


Information from Vasare Rastonis

- the scroll was treated in 30 cm sections so that the scroll could be repaired in manageable portions and to compliment the structure of the scroll
- all fragments of a section were lined with a very fine Japanese paper, Tengujo, using a thin application of Methyl cellulose

Conservation in Progress









- approximately 26 sections were lined/backed
- an additional blank space was added to represent a lost portion of the scroll
- once the scroll was in one piece, very small loose fragments were fit into place, where possible

- to give the scroll a stable upper and lower edge, the exposed Tengujo lining was covered with a medium weight Japanese paper, Chochin, using Methyl cellulose along the upper and lower portions of the scroll
- the scroll was reviewed numerous times for lifting edges and loose pieces, which when found were adhered into place with Methyl cellulose





- Okugaki in the scroll was by Mitsuoki Tosa (1617-1691) in Kanbun 3 [1663],
- The scroll was called “Shitamoe.”
- In this note, Mitsuoki acknowledged that the illustrations were by Mitsunobu Tosa (d. 1522) with a touch of help from Hinajo, perhaps his daughter Chiyojo.
- The original scroll was created during the Muromachi Period (1336-1573).
- Columbia’s copy was made after 1663, perhaps during the Edo period.

Conservation continued:

- a scroll clamp was built to widen the diameter of the scroll when rolled
- a drop spine box was built to support the scroll

Final dimensions: 6960mm x 390mm



下燃物語は鎌倉時代後期の作。内容は、物の下で燃えることから、心に思いこがれることをあらわし、歌謡で言えば恋恋になる。本文は「面白には、二月にひめのうさぎ給へして」に始まる、中納言(後の太納言)の中の懸想の作品である。

絵は大和絵の白描画系統を引き、人物は引目鉤鼻で墨を用いて描き、わずかに唇と燭台の灯りに朱を点している。優雅な貴族を描写するに相応しい清々しい絵である。寛文三年（一六六三）の奥書には、大和絵画家の絵所預土佐光信が、「本巻を、先祖の一人である土佐光信の真跡と鑑定したことと書き付けていた。光信は文明元年（一四六九）に絵所預に就任した絵師である。

本巻は、「鎌倉時代物語集成」第七巻に翻刻されている原本であり、他に同書のみを記した「徳久美文庫蔵巻子」本が知られるのみの、極めて珍重される物語である。
