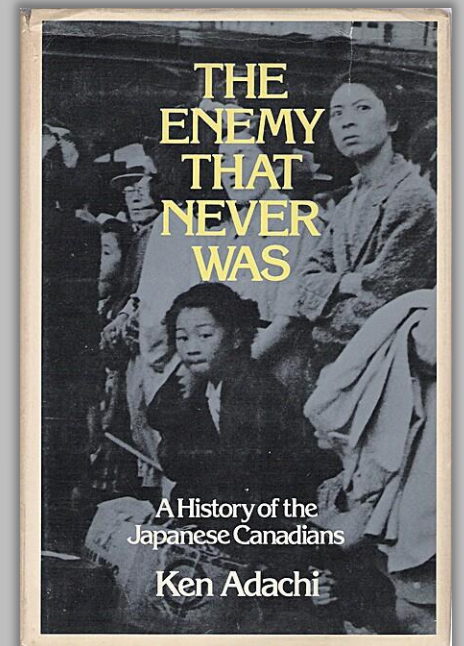

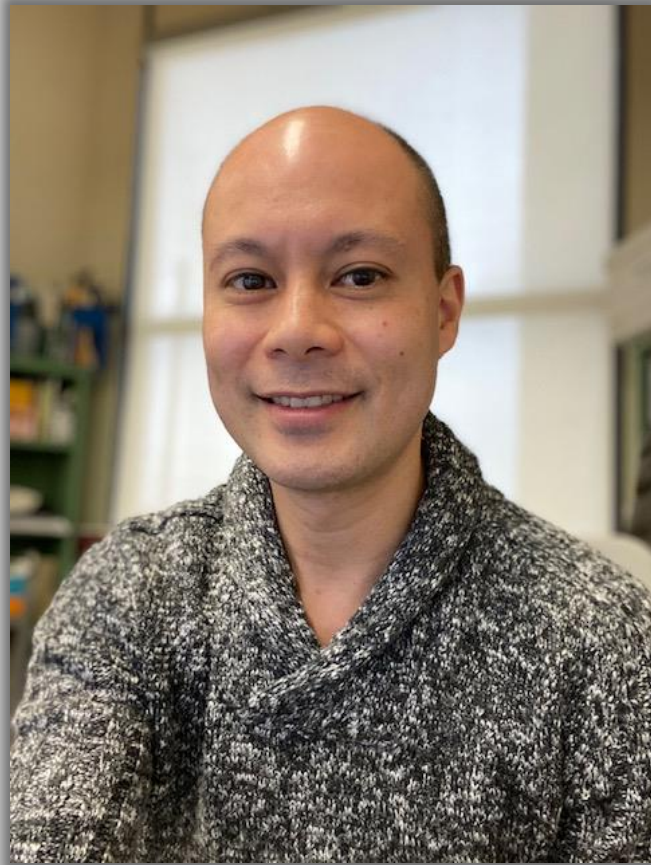


ABOUT THE JCRDB - 2

DEFINITIONS

In the context of the Japanese Canadian Researchers Directory & Bibliography, a **JAPANESE CANADIAN** is an individual who has Japanese ancestry

It includes those who were **born** in Canada, as well those who **immigrated** to and were/are **residents** of Canada

Recognizing that the experiences of the Issei differ depending on whether they immigrated to Canada prior to or post-war, tags have been assigned to differentiate individuals into distinct groups

Notes

"Grace Eiko Thomson, curator, historian and a social activist, was the founding director-curator of the Japanese Canadian National Museum, (now Nikkei National Museum) in Burnaby, BC. Born in Steveston's Japanese Fishermen's Hospital, she was raised in the Powell Street neighbourhood of Vancouver until her family was forced to leave in 1942. They settled in the self-supporting incarceration site of Minto, and in 1945 moved to Manitoba, eventually settling in Winnipeg, where she graduated high school, then business college. She worked as legal secretary to support her parents' re-settlement.

After marriage and while raising two sons, Grace studied at the University of Manitoba in 1973, receiving BFA (Honours) in drawing and sculpture in 1977. During this process, she began to look back at her own history as a Japanese Canadian Nisei. She continued her education, moving to graduate studies in Asian art history at University of British Columbia, and cultural studies under Dr. Griselda Pollock at University of Leeds. She worked as curator and art history instructor at University of Manitoba during this period. She was also art advisor to Baker Lake Inuit printmakers at Sanavik Cooperative, in the Northwest Territories. This experience, together with her next move in 1991 to a gallery in Prince Albert, Saskatchewan, where she worked with both Canadian and First Nations artists, inspired her to examine and to curate exhibitions based on cross-cultural themes. In 1995, she returned to Vancouver, as curator of Burnaby Art Gallery, where she curated a series of exhibitions titled Tracing Cultures.

As Executive Director/Curator, she opened, in 2000, the Japanese Canadian National Museum, in Burnaby, BC, with the inaugural exhibition, Re-Shaping Memory, Owning History: Through the Lens of Japanese Canadian Redress. She left this position in 2002, but curated two more exhibitions, Shashin, history of Japanese Canadian studio photographers to 1942, and Leveling the Playing Field: Vancouver Asahi baseball team, on contract.

She then served on the Board of the National Association of Japanese Canadians as President and Past President. She continues to advise on topics related to Japanese Canadian history and culture, and to speak in Canada, the US, and Japan. As well, she takes part in community committees on current issues related Downtown Eastside, where Japanese Canadians once lived.

She says, 'I believe art is about finding one's place, the journey not limited by one's own history, but about expanding one's thoughts through sharing with others. It is, in my opinion, solely about living. Living and doing without necessarily having to consciously interpret, define, or choose.'"

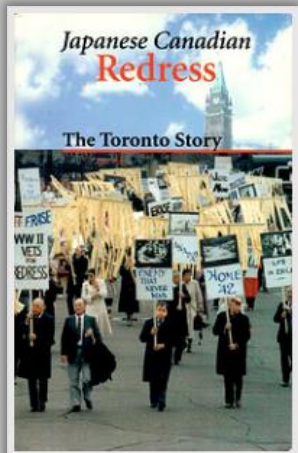

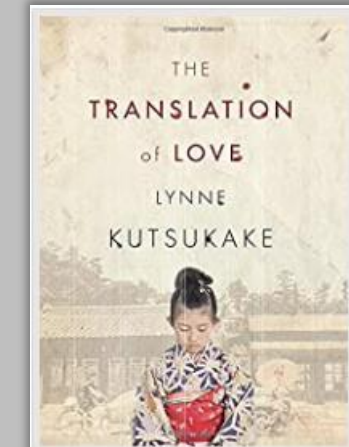
SCOPE

Other relevant topics such as education, sociology, ethnicity, minorities, multiculturalism, anti-racism, social justice also hold a place of importance in the database



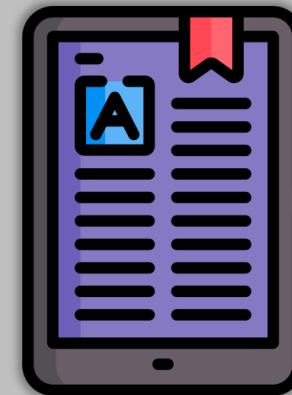

TAGGING SYSTEM - 1

A tagging system was developed to enhance searching and browsing capabilities. Tags were added to researcher and resource entries

By clicking on a specific tag, one can retrieve all entries that have been assigned the same tag (e.g., all researchers whose field of activity or research interest is Sociology (field))

Formatted Tag Examples	Usage
Japanese Canadian (identity)	Indicates that researchers are identified as Japanese Canadians based on the definitions established for this database
Sansei (generation)	Indicates that the researcher is a third generation Japanese Canadian
Japanese diaspora (field)	Indicates that Japanese diaspora is the field of activity or research interest of the researcher
University of Toronto (affiliation)	Indicates researcher's institutional affiliation
Canada (associated place)	Indicates place of birth, residence or geographical area of interest
Autobiographical fiction (genre)	Indicates the genre of the resource
Academic theses (pubtype)	Indicates the publication format for non-book resources
