- UCC School of Asian Studies founded in 2009
 - Department of Asian Studies, Study of Religions Department
 - External funding: Confucius Institute, Korea Society, Japan Society
 - Professorship and Programme in Chinese Studies
 - Irish Institute of Korean Studies (Dr. Kevin Cawley)
 - Japanese Language Classes
 - Japan-related research professorship in the departments Study of Religion (Prof. Brian Bocking, East Asian Religions) and Philosophy (Prof. Graham Parks, Asian Philosophy)
 - → Irish Institute of Japanese Studies (Dep. of Asian Studies / Dep. of Philosophy)
 - 2014: Establishment of Lectureship for Japanese Studies at the Dep. of Asian Studies

Location of Japanese / Japanese Studies

- School of Languages, Literatures and Cultures
 - Department of Asian Studies joined the school in 2018
 - One Professorship in Asian Studies (Prof. Kiri Paramore)
 - Two lectureships in Chinese Studies, One in Chinese Linguistics, One in Korean Studies, one in Japanese Studies
 - Additional language teachers (Confucius Institute, Hourly basis)
- Outside the School
 - Lectureship in East Asian Religion (Studies of Religion department)
 - Asian Philosophy (Department of Philosophy)
- Irish Institute of Japanese Studies

Programmes

- Japanese language and content modules in different programmes:
- BA Arts
- BA Arts International
- BA World Languages
- MA Asian Studies

Department and Library

- No Asia specialist in the library
- Departmental "Library Representative"
- Receives information regarding budget
- Forwards book orders from members of the department
 - → Reminding colleagues to order books
- No concrete agenda
 - → How do I engage colleagues?
 - → What materials would help our students?

How can we ensure that students use materials?

Library Budget

- Library budget across different departments
 - → No clear "Japan"-budget
- Limited library budget after the financial crisis of 2008
- Purchases focus on undergraduate teaching
- Longer history of library acquisitions for religion- and philosophyrelated topics
- Japanese Studies modules first established in 2014: focus on Cultural History, Japanese Society and Politics
- Focus on English language publications
- Standard access to portal content, e.g. Project Muse, JSTOR
 non-departmental budget







- Access to standard journals via Project Muse, JSTOR, Taylor & Francis Online etc.


